



MGT 338: Risk and Vulnerability Assessments for Rural Communities

MGT 338 Risk and Vulnerability Assessments for Rural Communities is an eight-hour training program designed to educate participants on the need for and basic components of a comprehensive risk and vulnerability assessment that brings together stakeholders from both the public and private sector. Risk and vulnerability assessments are particularly important in rural communities because of the lack of overlapping resources and redundant systems, as well as the strategic role that nontraditional facilities and assets play in the overall infrastructure of the community. As an initial step to creating resiliency against disaster, rural communities should begin with a comprehensive risk and vulnerability assessment. This **tuition free** course will expose participants to the benefits of evaluating a community's susceptibility to potential hazards and of identifying strategies for mitigating the risk of serious consequences.



Topics covered include but are not limited to:

- **Formation and composition of an RVA team to conduct the assessment.**
- **Role of the private sector in a comprehensive RVA.**
- **Formula for determining economic impacts of the loss of key assets and critical infrastructure.**
- **Multi-jurisdictional risk assessments.**
