1. TIM's – Traffic Incident Management Safety: 4 hour class, morning, no limit

This class will provide information from the National Traffic Safety Council and National Department of Transportation on recommended practices for emergency vehicle placement and rescue personnel safety while operating near moving motor vehicle traffic incidents.

2. South Dakota Fire Incident Reporting: 4 hour class, afternoon, no limit

Everyone hates paperwork, but having a good report on file for the incidents you respond to helps not only your department, but also assists the state and federal agencies with more accurate statistics as to the problem fire plays within our nation. "Do I really need to fill one of these reports out when I go get Mrs. Jones cat out of a tree?" I can assure you that having a report for something like this on file may prove beneficial for you and/or someone on your department in the event Mrs. Jones' cat scratches you while you get it out of the tree and a week later you need to go see the Dr. and his diagnosis is: "Cat Scratch fever." This may sound absurd as an example, but what about when a lawyer starts asking you questions about you and your department's response to a fatal house fire that occurred nearly five years prior? The Chief doesn't have to be the only one to fill out these reports. The officer in charge should be the one to fill out the report for when they are in charge and/or at least obtain all of the needed information for the person that will write the report thereafter.

3. Courage to be Safe (CTBS): 4 hour class, morning, no limit

This course is a provocative and moving presentation by the National Fallen Firefighters Foundation, through the Everyone Goes Home® Program, that is designed to change the culture of accepting the loss of firefighters as a normal occurrence. Building on the untold story of line of duty death survivors, it reveals how family members must live with the consequences of a firefighter death. This presentation provides a focus on the need for firefighters and officers to change fundamental attitudes and behaviors in order to prevent line of duty deaths. The central theme promotes the courage to do the right thing in order to protect yourself and other firefighters and ensure that "Everyone Goes Home" at the end of the day. Firefighters must have the courage to face a multitude of risks in order to save lives and protect their communities. Their courage allows them to willingly risk their own lives so that others can be saved. A different type of courage is required to stay safe in potentially dangerous situations, avoiding needless risks and tragic consequences.

4. Leadership, Accountability, Culture and Knowledge (LACK): 4 hour class, afternoon, no limit

Is your department on the path to a LODD? This compelling presentation by the National Fallen Firefighter Foundation examines the root causes of LODDs and the role of Leadership, Accountability, Culture and Knowledge as it influences the end result. Many fire departments across the United States "LACK the Right Stuff" to prevent them from being on a path to a line of duty death, with Leadership, Accountability, Culture and Knowledge being the elements that need to be addressed and managed in those environments. Through education and training, those departments can improve their survivability by understanding the root causes of firefighter fatalities and tackling these four elements with special emphasis on understanding fire service culture.

5. SCBA Confidence Course: all day class, limit 20

This course is designed to give the firefighter the confidence to successfully deal with situations that may be encountered in a fire situation. Firefighters will practice using the SCBA and will increase comfort and confidence to relate to real-life situations. Students will also gain information about air management.

PPE and SCBA are required.

6. Tactical Capabilities Workshop: All day Class, limit 30

The Blue Cell, LLC, under the direction of Todd Manns, facilitate, a one day exercise session that picks up where ICS 200 leaves off and tests specific emergency response issues using a tactical diorama and other stimulus. Radios, vests and resources are supplied during the scenario. Participants will also use other management tools that are provided to create realistic hands on experience. A number of techniques will be used during these tabletops to critically evaluate and have the tools to improve both the plan and the future capabilities in the area of emergency response. **Core Capabilities in the exercises:** On scene Incident Management, Emergency Public Information and Warning, Planning and Communications.
