

## Get It Together!

Effective December 31, 2009, to apply for or renew your driver license or identification card you will need to provide the documents listed below.

Make your visit to the driver exam station a successful one. Learn about the new identification requirements so you can come prepared when applying for, or renewing, your driver license.

One of the following to prove identity, date of birth and lawful status:

- Certified U.S. birth certificate
- Valid unexpired U.S. passport
- Certificate of Naturalization
- Certificate of Citizenship
- Valid unexpired permanent resident card
- Valid unexpired employment authorization document
- Foreign passport with valid unexpired U.S. Visa with I-94

If your name is different than the name on your identity document you will need to bring additional proof of your legal name. Acceptable documents for proof of legal name change are:

- Marriage certificate (issued by a state vital records agency)
- Certified adoption document
- Certified court order authorizing a name change (such as a divorce decree)

One document proving Social Security number. The documents below serve as proof of Social Security number:

- Social Security card
- W-2 Form
- SSA 1099 Form
- Non-SSA 1099 Form
- Pay stub (must include name and social security number)

In addition to the documents listed above you must provide two documents proving your principal address. Please bring two of the documents listed below (must have been issued in the last 90 days):

- Utility bill
- Rent receipt
- Phone bill
- Transcript or report card from an accredited school
- Bank statement
- Pay stub or earnings statement
- Credit card statement

The following must contain their current address and have been issued within the past year:

- Mortgage document
- Tax document
- Court order
- Homeowners/renter's insurance policy

The new licensing rules and other actions will help to establish a more secure driver license, and will help address our shared concern over national security, identity theft and highway safety.
