Live Fire Training (Propane Fueled Live Fire)

Live fire attack and firefighter technique Training (8 hours)

Training will consist of a short AM classroom session covering Safety, SCBA basics and Fire Streams. The remainder of the day will consist of hands on training using the Mobile Live Fire Training Unit. Participants will put their previous knowledge and skills to use in the two-story Training Unit. Training will simulate conditions encountered in actual interior structure fires (live fire, heat, humidity and smoke). During the evolutions, students will be able to practice SCBA usage, emergency SCBA procedures, hose handling, nozzle techniques, fire attach, ventilation and more. Participants will have the opportunity to practice multiple fire attach scenarios including ground level entry and basement fires as well as rescue procedures. Any students need to fulfill the 'Live Fire Training' portion of their SD FF Certification Card should bring it to class. If all prerequisites are met the applicable hands on tasks on the card can be completed and signed.

Class limit: 20

Instructors: Platte Fire Department MLFTU Cadre

Prerequisites: Participants must be 18 years of age, in good health, have a good working knowledge of SCBA and have had training in SAFETY, FIRE BEHAVIOR, PPE, FIRE HOSE & APPLIANCES, HOSE STREAMS & VENTILATION. Participants will be required to read and sign a SAFETY GUIDELINE DOCUMENT as well as a LIABILITY WAIVER DOCUMENT that also indicates they meet the minimum participation requirements.

PPE & Equipment Requirements: Students must have full Structural PPE (including hood) and SCBA in **GOOD & SERVICEABLE condition** that was NFPA compliant at manufacture date. If possible a spare SCBA cylinder should be brought as well as students will consume a great deal of air.

Navigation for Search & Rescue Teams

This course is designed to help search and rescue teams to stay organized at calls. We will relate all three navigational aids, the use maps, compass and GPS to aid in search patterns. We will discuss what type of search to use for different situations for lost persons to achieve best outcomes. The morning session will be classroom and the afternoon session will be hands-on. Please bring your compass and gps equipment.
