

Below is a list of possible funding grants, training, exercise and purchasing sources that could be available to South Dakota Fire Departments. Departments will still need to do their own research to determine eligibility, application/funding timeframes and what the funding is authorized to support. FEMA Assistance to Firefighters Grant Program:

Assistance to Firefighter Grant (AFG): *AFG has helped firefighters and other first responders to obtain critically needed equipment, protective gear, emergency vehicles, training, and other resources needed to protect the public and emergency personnel from fire and related hazards.*

Staffing for Adequate Fire & Emergency Response Grant (SAFER): *Provide funding directly to fire departments and volunteer firefighter interest organizations to help them increase or maintain the number of trained, "front line" firefighters available in their communities.*

Fire Prevention and Safety Grant (FP&S): *Support projects that enhance the safety of the public and firefighters from fire and related hazards.*

Community Development Block Grants (CDBG): *Correct deficiencies in public facilities that affect the public health, safety or welfare- Fire Stations, Water systems, etc.*

Volunteer Fire Assistance: *Organize, train and equip fire departments in rural areas and rural communities to prevent and suppress fires.*

Federal Excess Personal Property / Firefighter Property Program: *Programs provide a low-cost means for communities to protect their citizens from fire. Equipment that is no longer needed by the Federal Government, but which is suitable for conversion to fire service use, may be **loaned** to fire departments.*

Ordering Wildland Fire Equipment: *South Dakota Wildland Fire Division assists rural fire departments in South Dakota with obtaining equipment, supplies, and grant funding to provide protection for their communities.*

Through agreements with the US Forest Service and the Defense Logistics Agency, we are able to purchase fire supplies and equipment from federal contracts. This service provides fire departments the opportunity to purchase items at a substantial savings.
