# SD Certified Firefighter Course Syllabus (For any new courses starting after July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021)

**Course Description:** The SD Certified Firefighter Course is the foundation of the SD Fire Service Training Program. Below is a listing of the curriculum, online training course sections, hands on skills and testing that are required to become a SD Certified Firefighter. Course curriculum follows the NFPA 1001 (2019 edition) Standard for Fire Fighter Professional Qualifications for Firefighter I and Firefighter II.

**Options:** SD Fire Departments/Instructors now have the option of delivering the SD Certified Firefighter course using:

- 1. A traditional classroom setting.
- 2. A combination of the traditional classroom and online course curriculum.

**Instructor:** The course must be proctored/led by a SD Certified Fire Service Instructor.

**Funding:** \$750.00 in SD Firefighter Essentials Grant Program funding may be available to a grantee agency upon successful completion of the SD Certified Firefighter Course, The State Fire Marshal's Office needs to be contacted and the Firefighter Essentials Grant Project Agreement completed before the start of a SD Certified Firefighter Course. Layout of the information is slightly different in each curriculum, so use the attached correlation guide below to match each online course with the proper curriculum chapter.

### Testing:

- (Online Classes/combination traditional classroom) Students must pass the Online Course
   Chapter testing to get certificate/credit for that specific class. The online testing/completion
   will be monitored directly by the State Fire Marshal's office and the Class Proctor/ Lead
   Instructor.
- Student must pass the Fire Fighter I and Fire Fighter II written tests with a 70% or better grade. (Tests given by the State Fire Marshal's Office)
- Student must also pass the SD Certified Firefighter Practical Skill Test (State Fire Marshal's Office or Third-Party Evaluation)
- For the student to be eligible to participate in any live fire training evolution (Per NFPA 1403), they must take and pass the Firefighter I training and written test.

Note: If at any time throughout the course, the Proctor/Lead Instructor feels that a student may need additional time in a particular subject matter (whether that be classroom, online instruction or hands on skills), they may instruct the student to retake any portion of the course they deem necessary. It is the Proctor/Lead Instructors ultimate responsibility to make sure that their students have met the minimum level of knowledge, skills and abilities to be able to be called a SD Certified Firefighter.

To be able to take the SD Certified Firefighter Practical Skill Test, the SD Certified Firefighter Certification Card must be fully completed by having all the Firefighter I and Fire Fighter II class sections signed and dated; all performance competencies on the back of the card signed and dated; show that the Firefighter I and Firefighter II written tests were passed (initialed by FMO Staff); the student's signature, lead instructor's signature and the student departments Fire Chief's signature on the back of the SD Certified Firefighter Certification Card.

Students that pass the Fire Fighter I and Fire Fighter II written test but are not able to perform any performance Competencies or Practical Skill Test, would not meet the level for Certified Firefighter certification, but would be eligible for the **SD Fire Ground Support** designation.

The State Fire Marshal's office will use the Fire Fighter I, Fire Fighter II written tests and the SD Certified Firefighter Practical Skills evaluation to confirm those students' training before allowing them certification.

Timeframe to Complete: The State Fire Marshal's Office allows the students up to a 3-year timeframe in which to complete the SD Certified Firefighter course once they start taking classes. Note: SD Fire Departments may require a quicker timeline for completion of this course for the members under their control. Note: (ATS Online) Access codes are only good for just one year (September 1 to August 31) or they must keep it activated to complete the class.

The sections listed below are to be completed for each section before a student can qualify to take the corresponding SD Certified Firefighter written test. The performance competencies are listed on the back of the students Certification Green card.

#### PERFORMANCE COMPETENCIES

Given a selection of portable extinguishers, demonstrate extinguishment of an actual incipient stage class A, B, or C fires

Given rope and a 24' ladder, raise and extend ladder and hoist a tool.

Using simulation, force entry through two type of doors, two types of windows and a wall or floor

Horizontally ventilate a building using positive and/or negative pressure ventilation

Connect a fire department pumper to a fire hydrant and operate the hydrant

Connect a fire department pumper to static water supply

Unload and carry hose up a stairway and/or ladder.

While wearing full PPE demonstrate proficiency in the operation of SCBA while conducting a search in a smoke filled or visibility obscured structure. (Smoke machine or simulated IDLH)

Working as a member of a team, extricate a victim from a vehicle

As a member of a firefighting team, in full PPE and SCBA, participate in the control of a live fire. & Chapter 16: Building Materials, Structural Collapse and Effects of Fire Suppression
