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FI-110, WILDLAND FIRE OBSERVATIONS AND ORIGIN SCENE PROTECTION FOR FIRST RESPONDERS – (8 hrs.) The primary emphasis of this course is to teach sound wildland fire observations and origin scene protection practices that enable first responders to a wildland fire scene to perform proper origin scene protection procedures. The course is presented by short lectures, electronic presentations, exercises, and class discussion.

L-280, FOLLOWERSHIP TO LEADERSHIP – (16 hrs.) This training course is designed as a self-assessment opportunity for individuals preparing to step into a leadership role. The course combines one day of classroom instruction followed by a second day in the field with students working through a series of problem solving events in small teams (Field Leadership Assessment Course). Topics include leadership values and principles, transition challenges for new leaders, situational leadership, team cohesion factors, ethical decision making, and after action review techniques. Some course delivery may be arduous in nature.

RT-130, ANNUAL FIRELINE SAFETY REFRESHER TRAINING – (4 hrs.) The four hour Annual Fireline Safety Refresher will provide up to date fireline safety information for firefighters holding Incident Command System qualifications requiring this training per PMS 310-1, Wildland Fire Qualification System Guide.

S-133, LOOK UP, LOOK DOWN, LOOK AROUND - (4 hrs.) This course is designed to train Incident Commander Type 5 (ICT5) and Firefighter Type 1 (FFT1) to identify environmental factors and indicators of hazardous fire conditions, and how to use these indicators when implementing the Risk Management Process. The course is a CD-based classroom course, based on facilitated exercises. This course is required for advancement to ICT5 and/or FFT1.

S-211, PORTABLE PUMPS AND WATER USE – (16-20 hrs.) This course is designed to provide knowledge and skills to design, setup, operate, troubleshoot, and shut down portable water delivery systems. The focus is on portable pumps – it does not address water delivery for engines. Topics covered include: portable water delivery systems; equipment; roles and responsibilities; and system design and hydraulics. There is also a field exercise where students will apply what they learned in the classroom. Students must bring all wildland PPE to participate in the field exercise.

S-215, FIRE OPERATIONS IN THE WILDLAND/URBAN INTERFACE – (16-24 hrs.) This is an instructor-led course. Instructional units include firefighter safety in the interface, managing human factors in the interface, pre-incident planning, sizeup and initial strategy, structure triage, structure protection overview, tactics in the interface, tactical operations and resource use in the interface, action assessment, plan update, and after action review.

All wildland fire training presented at the Eastern South Dakota Wildland Fire Academy will meet the standards set forth by the National Wildfire Coordinating Group (NWCG.)
