The American Legion of South Dakota and the South Dakota Highway Patrol Youth Trooper Academy Overview

The Program:

The South Dakota Highway Patrol Youth Trooper Academy is a cooperative effort between the South Dakota Highway Patrol and the American Legion of South Dakota.

Our mission is to recruit young men and women from culturally diverse backgrounds from across the state of South Dakota, and to increase their understanding of the job of a state trooper. The program is designed to expose young adults to the demands of Highway Patrol Recruit training and to develop better relationships between the youth of our state and the Highway Patrol.

The Youth Trooper Academy is an intensive, one week, residential learning experience for young adults ages 16-17, who are entering their senior year of High School. The Youth Trooper Academy is held at the South Dakota Law Enforcement Training Academy in Pierre, South Dakota. The Youth Trooper Academy is not a summer camp and is not designed for troubled teenagers. The program is mentally and physically demanding. The Youth Trooper Academy utilizes a paramilitary approach to training, and discipline is strict. Candidates should be highly motivated, of good moral and ethical character, and have an interest in a career in law enforcement.

Veteran South Dakota Highway Patrol troopers will serve as mentors and chaperones during the week. Troopers and members from other law enforcement agencies throughout the state of South Dakota will provide classroom and hands-on training in topics such as firearms safety, defensive driving, crash investigation, traffic stops, leadership, defensive tactics, and criminal law. Youth Academy Cadets will also get to experience demonstrations from the Highway Patrol's special operations section such as air craft operation, SWAT, and Police Service Dogs.

Cadets that graduate from the program will be proud of their accomplishments. The lessons learned from this program will serve them well for years to come.

The 2013 Youth Trooper Academy runs June 24th – 28th. Space in the program is limited to 16 students from across the state.

Qualifications:

The program is open to male and female high school students 16-17 years of age who are entering their senior year of high school and have an interest in a career in law enforcement.

Candidates must be in good academic standing with their high school. They must be of good moral character and present a well-groomed appearance.

The candidates must possess a valid SD driver license.

The Youth Trooper Academy is physically demanding; those requiring special diets or having physical needs cannot be accepted. The program is open to all, regardless of race, color, gender, religion, or national origin.

Applications:

Applications may be obtained from any American Legion Post Commander or high school. Applications must be authorized by an American Legion Post.

If accepted, it will be the responsibility of the student to obtain a doctor's certification attesting to his or her fitness. This form will be mailed to successful applicants and must be returned on the date indicated.

A parent or legal guardian must sign a release of liability for the South Dakota Highway Patrol and the American Legion of South Dakota. The release of liability form is contained in the application and must be returned along with the student's application.

Application deadline is April 5th, 2013. All applications must be returned to your local American Legion Post.

Apply early as space is limited.

It is our hope that participants in the Youth Trooper Academy will return to their communities with a clearer understanding of State Trooper responsibilities. We are confident the Youth Trooper Academy will instill in these young men and women a newfound or increased respect for the Highway Patrol and when they return to their communities, they will share their experiences.

All accepted applicants will be sent a packet which includes:

- A formal letter of acceptance with report date and time
- Required equipment and clothing list
- Medical verification form
- List of personal items to bring
- Directions to the SD Law Enforcement Training Academy
